Acknowledgement to Country

We acknowledge the Traditional Custodians of the land on which you will visit, the Bunurong people. We pay our respects to their Elders past and present.

Wominjeka (welcome) and we ask that you respect this land during your visit. Bunurong people know Phillip Island as Millowl. This is Bunurong Country and part of Victoria's Kulin nation. All our Country is highly significant, every square inch, every rock, every leaf, every dune and every artefact. The coastline of Millowl contains layers and layers of burnt shell (kitchen middens). Some of these layers have gaps of over 1,000 years between them, where our people eventually sat directly over the same place again, over 1,000 years later, to do the same thing: make fire, cook food, eat together and tell stories. The whole region is connected by thousands of generations worth of tradition, story and song.

Adventure time

Want to push yourself to the limit? Phillip Island is a veritable playground for adrenaline-seeking adventurers.

These five activities will help you to see the island from a fresh perspective.

HELICOPTER FLIGHTS

See Phillip Island and surrounds from above on an exiting scenic helicopter adventure with **Phillip Island Helicopters**. If you're looking for a memorable way to cap off your stay, a helicopter trip is one you won't forget.

INDOOR CLIMBING

The perfect rainy-day activity for people of all ages, hitting the climbing wall at <u>Clip 'n Climb</u> is a great way to push yourself to new limits indoors.

JET BOATING

Want to add some excitement to your day? Take to the sea aboard a fast and furious jet boat with <u>Ocean Adventures</u> to fly along the waters off Cape Woolamai.

GO KARTS

Go karting on a replica of the **Phillip Island Grand Prix Circuit** is a fun way for the whole family to get their thrills. The ocean views from the track are incredible too!

KAYAKING

Family fun

From spotting native wildlife to exploring rock pools at the beach, Phillip Island is packed with activities perfect for kids of all ages.

BEACH DAYS

Have fun swimming Smiths Beach, which is patrolled during summer. Learn to surf with one of the surf schools operating there. Enjoy the calmer conditions at Cowes Main Beach — the perfect spot for an afternoon dip. At low tide, explore the marine life in and around the rock pools at Smiths Beach and Kitty Miller Bay.

WATERPLAY

Have fun swimming at Smiths Beach. Learn something new by booking stand-up paddle board lessons for your whole family, or explore Phillip Island's amazing coastline on a guided sea kayaking tour. Hire a boat and head out for a day of fishing, or book a fishing charter out of San Remo.

GET BACK TO NATURE

Switch off your phones and devices to wander through native bushland, hike the rugged coastline or hire some bikes from <u>Super Cruzer</u> for a family ride along a bush trail.





ANIMAL ENCOUNTERS

Keep your eyes peeled for the myriad of native wildlife that call the Island home (see page 14). Heading out to sea on a cruise with <u>Wildlife Coast Cruises</u> to see the local Australian fur seal colony basking on rocks is a top activity for the young and not-so-young, while the <u>Penguin Parade</u> is an enduring favourite. Come face to face with wildlife at Maru Koala and Animal Park.

JUST FOR FUN

Keep your clan entertained at a challenging maze, Magic Manor, mini golf courses or Sky Trail at <u>A Maze N' Things</u>. <u>Go karting, paintball</u> and <u>bowling</u> are always a winner with competitive kids. Without a doubt, the <u>Phillip Island Chocolate Factory</u> is the sweetest and most addictive attraction on Phillip Island! Satisfy that sweet tooth and visit Panny's Amazing World of Chocolate.

A WORLD AWAY

Explore the wide-open spaces and historical farm at <u>Churchill Island</u> and meet the farmer. Be sure to pay a visit to the <u>National Vietnam Veterans</u> <u>Museum</u> to remember, interpret and understand the experience of our veterans and view hundreds of fascinating artefacts. Take a virtual journey through the Southern Ocean to Antarctica with the interactive and immersive experiences at the <u>Antarctic Journey</u>.

Walk this way

Lace up your sneakers and step out to experience the wonders of Victoria's island sanctuary on foot with these top walks, as recommended by locals.



PYRAMID ROCK TO BERRYS BEACH

This epic walk along the clifftops between the famous scenic lookout and popular surf beach reveals views of the

ocean and surrounding farmland, as well as plenty of wildlife spotting opportunities. If you're fit and active, you should be able to finish this return walk in about two hours, depending on how often you stop to take in the stunning scenery.



KITTY MILLER BAY WALK

At low tide, this 2km coastal walk will reveal the atmospheric, rusty remains of the SS Speke shipwreck. Be sure to

wear good shoes as you'll need to clamber over slippery rocks and sand on this scenic walk that rewards you with incredible views and a slice of maritime history.



CHURCHILL ISLAND

A cruisy wander around the relatively flat 4km Churchill Island loop trail is a good option for families, older people or

anyone who wants to take it easy. You'll take in pretty views of Western Port Bay, see forests of ancient trees and pass by protected coastal wetlands populated by many species of native seabirds and shorebirds.



GEORGE BASS COASTAL WALK

Starting in San Remo or Kilcunda, the George Bass Coastal Walk is a cliff-top path which rises high above the pounding

surf of Bass Strait and offers spectacular panoramic coastal views. It is 7km one way, so fuel up with lunch or brunch before you depart on this rewarding walk!.



CAPE WOOLAMAI CIRCUIT

Expect to be blown away by panoramic views of the coastline on this walk best suited to active people. Apart from the stunning

views, migratory birds frequent this area, so keep an eye out for hooded plovers and short-tailed shearwaters. Between May and October, you might just catch a glimpse of migrating humpbacks, orcas and southern right whales in the ocean below too.



SWAN LAKE

If you love birds, then don't miss stretching your legs on this short circuit around a serene freshwater lake that's populated by many bird

species including cormorants and black swans. Wheelchair and pram-accessible, there are also a couple of bird hides by the lake for birdwatching enthusiasts to bunker down in with their binoculars or camera.



OSWIN ROBERTS RESERVE AND RHYLL INLET

These peaceful reserves connect and offer beautiful quiet walks surrounded by migratory birds,

butterflies, and if you're lucky, wallables and echidnas. The walking tracks in both of these areas are suitable for bicycles and the shorter loops are great for kids.



THE NOBBIES WALK

Follow the road past the Penguin Parade, through the scenic Summerland Peninsula, until you reach the very tip of the peninsula.

Take in the stunning views as you explore the boardwalks and see the explosive blowhole in action! Keep your eyes out for a sighting of the iconic little penguins, seabirds and whales passing by in winter.

Rock stars

Atmospheric sea caves, red-tinged beach rocks and granite colonnades jutting out of the sea, Phillip Island's rock formations have real star power.



PYRAMID ROCK

A walk along the coastal cliff-top track from Berrys Beach will reveal Pyramid Rock rising up out of the Bass Strait.



RED ROCKS BEACH Kids will love exploring Red Rocks Beach, Cowes' quiet and calm bay beach home to red-hued rock formations.



THE NOBBIES

Take in the wonder of the rugged, southern coast while wandering along the boardwalk at the Nobbies Reserve.



THE PINNACLES

Lace up your walking shoes to marvel at the wild beauty of The Pinnacles while doing the Cape Woolamai Coastal Walk.



OLD GRANITE QUARRY The Old Granite Quarry Walk reveals beautiful beach vistas and remnants of Cape Woolamai's industrial history.



FORREST CAVES

Accessible at low tide, these picturesque sea caves are popular with photographers who love to capture the sun filtering in through the crevices.

Meet the locals

Beyond its famous penguins, Phillip Island is home to a curious collection of unique birds, monotremes and aquatic wildlife. With a diversity of colourful native birds, marine mammals and icons of the Australian bush, Phillip Island is paradise for wildlife lovers.

Away from the traffic and noise of the city, the island is a great place to encounter wildlife.



Have fun ticking off some (or all) of these local wildlife experiences.


LITTLE PENGUINS



The <u>Penguin</u> <u>Parade</u> is a timeworn Phillip Island tradition that has drawn visitors from far and wide for a century. Watch in wonder as hundreds of

Little Penguins waddle from the sea at dusk, then clamber to their nests in the dunes.

AUSTRALIAN FUR SEAL



Australia's largest fur seal colony can be found just off the coast of Phillip Island. Jump on a Wildlife Coast Cruise and head out to Seal Rocks to see

thousands of these marine mammals sunning themselves on rocks.

CAPE BARREN GOOSE



Thousands of these large, grey geese with striking yellow-green bills can be found on Phillip Island. In the 1950s, population

numbers of this species were incredibly low, but a rescue and breeding program reversed this bird's decline, with its population now considered stable.

SHORT-BEAKED ECHIDNA



Active during both day and night, these small, spiky monotremes can occasionally be spotted in bushland or feeding on ants

and grass on roadsides throughout the island. Be sure to drive with care to keep these special native critters safe.

KOALAS



Wander the treetop boardwalks at the Koala Conservation

Reserve to see the resident koalas snoozing and feeding in the surrounding

eucalypts, oblivious to the noisy birdlife.

PELICANS



Marvel at the majestic pelicans as they swoop to scoop a fish from the sea or visit the foreshore next to San Remo at midday to watch them lining up for a feed.

PURPLE SWAMPHEN



This attractive native bird with a bright red bill and purple-blue breast can be found wandering in the water in Phillip Island's wetland areas such as

Swan Lake in Summerland.

SWAMP WALLABIES



These adorable wallabies have a distinctive light cheek stripe and are much smaller than a kangaroo. They are the only species found on the island and can be seen in grassy

areas and are most active at dawn and dusk.

SHORT-TAILED SHEARWATER



Also known as mutton birds, this species of migratory bird can be found on Phillip Island from September to April. After making the epic journey

from Alaska's Aleutian Islands, these birds build a burrow into the sandy dunes of the coast, where they lay a single egg in November. Once the egg hatches in January, the chick is fed by its parents until it migrates back to Alaska in April.

WHALES



Humpback whales, southern right whales and sometimes even orcas can be spotted off the coast of Phillip Island from May to

October. Head out on a <u>Wildlife Coast</u> <u>Cruise</u> to see them or stay on dry land and keep your eyes peeled along the <u>Bass Coast Whale Trail</u>. Some excellent vantage points on the island are Cape Woolamai, The Nobbies or Pyramid Rock.

EASTERN BARRED BANDICOOT



Until October 2022, these cute little creatures were marked as extinct in the wild. But now, thanks to the tireless work of the Phillip Island Nature Parks and

a fox free island, there are two thriving populations on Churchill Island and the Summerland Peninsula. They live a solitary, secretive life foraging in open grassland at night and can be difficult to spot.

All about events

Major events are part of our DNA!

Home to two world-class motorcycle championships — the Australian Motorcycle Grand Prix (MotoGP) and Superbike World Championship — <u>Phillip Island's</u> <u>Grand Prix Circuit</u> provides a spectacular venue and backdrop for international and national motorsport events.

Music events include the annual <u>Ocean</u> <u>Sounds</u> series, featuring talented local musical acts in beautiful relaxed settings.

People with a passion for open water swimming and running can get involved in the Bass Coast Series, including one of the local favourites, the San Remo Channel Challenge.



The Island Whale Festival and San Remo Fishing Festival celebrate the region's natural environment and provide interactive experiences and fun activities for all ages.

Staying safe while on the road

When visiting our region you'll often see local wildlife on the roads and roadside. Help protect native wildlife (and yourself) by driving carefully.

SLOW DOWN

Reduce your speed to prevent collisions with wildlife.

STAY ALERT

Wildlife can be more active near roadsides and harder to see at sunrise and sunset.

EXPECT THE UNEXPECTED

Wildlife can be unpredictable. It's hard to know what they'll do next, so keep this in mind while travelling in the region.

BRAKE SAFELY

Always apply your brakes in a controlled manner.

AVOID SWERVING SUDDENLY

Never swerve if you see wildlife on the road and avoid swerving violently to avoid the animal as this can cause you to lose control of your vehicle.

REPORT INJURED WILDLIFE

If you encounter an injured animal call Wildlife Victoria on **03 8400 7300**

warrigal greens and lemon myrtle. Visit **Omaru Farm Café & Restaurant** for a tasty Sri-Lankan feast with lots of the produce lovingly grown on site.

Drop in to Bass Strait Direct

in Newhaven to stock up on locally-caught gummy shark and scallops. Head to local institution San Remo Fisherman's

Co-op for a delicious and fresh seafood feast – right off the boats. If fresh sushi is more your thing, you can't go past **Youkis Japanese** in Cowes. For lovingly created modern Greek cuisine with beautiful bay views, dine at **Bani's Restaurant & Bar**.

COFFEE PLEASE



Get your caffeine fix and a legendary toastie at <u>G'Day Tiger</u> in Cowes or <u>The Store</u> in Ventnor. For beachside brews, visit <u>M&O Cafe</u> on the Esplanade

in Cowes or <u>Smiths Bar & Beach Food</u>. Just over the bridge in Newhaven <u>3925 Espresso</u> offers a welcome break and some local produce to stock up on for your visit. Apart from selling seriously good coffee, <u>The Waterboy Cafe</u> in Cowes also stocks a supreme selection of freshly baked cakes and muffins.



WINE TIME



Bold reds, crisp whites and everything in between can be savoured at the **Phillip Island Winery** restaurant or cellar door, **Purple Hen**

Winery or just off the Island at The Gurdies Winery. Try a selection of local and regional wines in style at cosy, intimate Grenache Wine Bar or our newest chic venue, The Tipsy Cowe.

MORE CHEESE PLEASE



Bassine

Speciality Cheeses, on the Bass Highway in Glen Forbes, is where you'll find handmade artisan farmhouse cheeses.

Stop in to support an impressive local producer creating high quality haloumi, brie, camembert and feta.



On the water

Swimming, surfing, kneeboarding, kitesurfing, fishing and stand-up paddleboarding — Phillip Island is a playground for watersports fans.

GONE FISHING

Fishing is a local industry around Phillip Island, with the fleet based at San Remo.

For the rod and line fishers, toss a line in from the jetties at Grantville, Cowes, Newhaven, Rhyll, San Remo and Corinella.

Charter fishing expeditions depart from Rhyll and San Remo, and boats can be hired at Rhyll and Corinella.


Flathead, snapper, channel whiting, King George whiting, Australian salmon, flounder, elephant fish, school and gummy shark, garfish, trevally and pike can all be caught in the area.

Boat ramps are located at Rhyll, Anderson Road in Cowes West, Newhaven, Corinella and Grantville.

Stop by Jim's Bait & Tackle in San Remo to stock up on fishing supplies and local tips.

You'll need a license to fish in Western Port, so get one at a fishing outlet or online before casting off. Regulations on maximum and minimum sizes of fish also apply.





SURF'S UP

Phillip Island National Surfing Reserve includes the breaks at Cape Woolamai, Smiths, Summerland and Cat Bay. Book some surf lessons with a local operator if you're new to the sport or want to brush up on your skills.

SURF SAFETY

Surf beaches on the south coast can be very dangerous. Swim between the flags at beaches that are patrolled seasonally and talk to the lifesavers about where to swim.




